Re-Activation Policy

In the event a brother should become inactive as a result of failure to fulfill constitutional provisions of active membership, the following re-activation scheme will be offered to said brother in the semester immediately following de-activation. For students studying abroad in the semester following de-activation this scheme will be offered upon return to campus.

For students failing to fulfill service requirements, a petition for re-activation must be filed with the Executive Board by the tenth class day of the term. Petitioner will be required to complete two hours of service to the fraternity and the balance of unfinished service hours from the semester prior no later than midnight the night prior to the sixth chapter meeting of the semester. A vote will be held at the sixth chapter meeting of the semester to re-activate petitioner contingent upon requirements being met. A two-thirds majority vote will be required to re-activate petitioner. As a punitive measure, six hours of service with Alpha Phi Omega will be required in addition to the requirements of the Service Policy during the semester of re-activation. Total service will equal no less than twenty hours for the semester.

For students failing to fulfill attendance requirements, a petition for re-activation must be filed with the Executive Board by the tenth class day of the term. Petitioner will be required to complete four hours of service to the fraternity no later than midnight the night prior to the sixth chapter meeting of the semester. A vote will be held at the sixth chapter meeting of the semester to re-activate petitioner contingent upon requirements being met. A two-thirds majority vote will be required to re-activate petitioner. As a punitive measure, four hours of service with Alpha Phi Omega will be required in addition to the requirements of the Service Policy during the semester of re-activation. Total service will equal no less than twenty hours for the semester.

For students failing to fulfill dues requirements or have an outstanding account balance at the end of the term, unless prior arrangements have been made with the Treasurer, a petition for re-activation must be filed with the Executive Board by the tenth class day of the term. Petitioner will be required to complete four hours of service to the fraternity and repay the account balance from the semester prior no later than midnight the night prior to the sixth chapter meeting of the semester. A vote will be held at the sixth chapter meeting of the semester to re-activate petitioner contingent upon requirements being met. A two-thirds majority vote will be required to re-activate petitioner. As a punitive measure, four hours of service with Alpha Phi Omega will be required in addition to the requirements of the Service Policy during the semester of re-activation. Total service will equal no less than twenty hours for the semester.

For brothers failing to complete two or more provisions of active membership, the Chapter Review Board will designate the stipulations for re-activation according to the spirit of the Constitution and this policy.
