

## NOTICE OF CURRICULUM CHANGES 2016-2017

### **ECONOMICS AND FINANCE MAJOR**

The math requirements of the major have been changed to:  
MAT 130, and MAT 145 or MAT 170 or placement in MAT 171 or higher.  
This change applies to all currently enrolled students.

### **MATHEMATICS MAJOR**

The major requirement of MAT 200 or MAT 205 has been dropped and now students must complete four additional math electives numbered 301 or higher (instead of three).  
This change applies to students declaring the major in spring 2017 or later. Current juniors and seniors who would like to fulfill the new requirement instead of the old requirement may do so by informing the Registrar's Office.

### **GLOBAL COMMERCE MINOR**

The minor requirement of HIS 388 has been dropped and now students must complete the one-credit-hour course GLC 500 Global Commerce Capstone. This change applies to students declaring the major in spring 2017 or later. Students who declared the minor in 2016 but have yet to take HIS 388 will be required to take GLC 500 instead of HIS 388.

### **BIOLOGY MAJOR**

The requirement of MAT 130 has been changed to MAT 130 or MAT 205.  
This change applies to all currently enrolled students.

### **COMPUTER SCIENCE MAJOR AND MINOR**

The requirement of MAT 200 has been changed to MAT 200 or MAT 300.  
This change applies to all currently enrolled students.

### **ART HISTORY MAJOR**

The requirement of a foreign language course numbered 220 (or equivalent) has been dropped.  
This change applies to all currently enrolled students.

### **SPANISH MAJOR AND MINOR**

The following revised requirements of the Spanish major and minor are applicable to students graduating in 2020 or later. Students graduating 2019 may choose either the old or the new requirements.

#### **Requirements for the SPA Major:**

SPA 230, 240, 250, 255;  
One course numbered SPA 260-299;  
Two courses numbered SPA 300-399;  
SPA 450 Junior Seminar;  
SPA 500 Senior Seminar

#### **Spanish Minor**

Change the requirement of "One of SPA 260, 261, 270, 271 or 290" to "One course numbered SPA 260-299."

### **CLASSICAL STUDIES MAJOR AND MINOR**

The following changes to the classical studies major and minor are applicable to students declaring the major or minor in spring 2017 or later. 2018 graduates may have the option to fulfill either the old or the new requirements.  
The program will begin to offer two distinct tracks within the major:

### **A. Language** (5 courses)

5 courses in Greek or Latin (GRK, LAT), at least three of which must be at the 200-level or higher

### **B. Civilization** (2 courses)

1. CLA 301 or 302 (Greek *or* Roman History)
2. CLA 342 or 346 (Ancient Greek Culture and Society *or* Pompeii)

### **C. Electives** (2 courses)

2 of the following (or other courses with program committee approval):

3. Two additional CLA courses (may include additional courses from 1 and 2 above)

**C. Electives** (3 courses in consultation with faculty advisor, students will choose courses that allow them focus in a particular area)
